Seeds planted, harvest reaped in Coushatta

COUSHATTA, La. (LBM) – A season of prayer preceded a recent four-night crusade at Red River High School in Coushatta that saw 10 people come to Christ and many more seek personal revival.

Held July 11-14, the Red

River Crusade and Concert featured messages by Bill Britt, founder of Compel Outreach in Haughton, and music by the Jason Lovins Band and the New Hope No. 3 praise and worship team. Leading up to the crusade, Red River Parish congregations, representing multiple denominations, took part in coordinated individual times

of prayer.

Crusade organizer Shawn Beard, a member of Martin Baptist Church in Coushatta, said prayer was a solid foundation for a mighty movement of God during the course of the event.

"I personally think without prayer we are spinning

LA pulmonologist appeals to adults to get vaccinations

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – Frank Courmier, a pulmonologist at Our Lady of Lourdes Regional Medical Center in Lafayette, appealed to Louisiana Baptist state missions staff, July 20, urging them to receive the COVID-19 vaccine and to advocate for vaccinations among Louisiana Baptists.

Courmier, who conducted virus bioengineering research at M.D. Anderson in Houston, Texas, is chair of a regional coronavirus task force that encompasses the parishes surrounding Lafayette, and he is a member of the state task force on COVID-19.

He addressed key issues, and answered questions and concerns raised by individuals gathered at the Louisiana Baptist Building and from online participants, citing an urgency in getting out his message because of a fourth surge his hospital is facing. A 10-day increase from nine to 40 COVID, mostly unvaccinated patients, has caused the hospital to

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – Jay McCallum believes in public service, and living your whole life in service to Christ, he told

the *Baptist Message*.

"My wife and I came to an understanding a number of years ago that everything we do is to be part of our ministry and mission effort. And God is sovereign over all our lives, not just part of

our lives.

"When you look at Scripture, it's obvious," he offered. "The Holy Spirit reveals our whole lives are to be dedicated

BASELA names Sheridan as new director

BOGALUSA, La. (LBM) – The Baptist Associations of Southeast Louisiana has named member pastor Keith Sheridan to serve as the next associational missions strategist.

Sheridan, pastor of Lee's Creek Baptist Church in Bogalusa for the last five years, will begin serving in his new role August 9. While this is his first time to serve as a director of missions, Sheridan believes his experience at churches and in associational life has prepared him for this next chapter in ministry.

"I am both excited and terrified," Sheridan told the *Baptist Message*. "DOM's have an awesome responsibility. One can't

First Bossier dedicates facilities, celebrates God's victories

BOSSIER CITY, La. (LBM) – More than 1,400 members and guests packed the newly finished facilities of the First Baptist Church in Bossier City, July 11, for a special time of worship and celebration 31 months after a fire destroyed much of the buildings on campus.

“This rebuild journey has been filled with both challenges and victories,” Pastor Brad Jurkovich told the *Baptist Message*. “I believe God is giving us a season of victory at this time so that we are stronger than ever to share Jesus with our city, nation and world. Celebration Sunday was a powerful step in seeing God do incredible things in the coming years.”

Construction of the \$20 million, 70,000-square-foot

building was completed in early July and included a new chapel that incorporates some of the more traditional features of the original building that was destroyed, such as pew seating, but also modern elements, such as technology upgrades that allow multi-media presentations. The rebuilt campus includes a student center, foyer/event center and space for Sunday school classes and other small groups to meet.

RESEILIENT AMID ADVERSITY

On Dec. 10, 2018, a three-alarm fire began at 5:30 a.m., originating with an uninterruptible power supply backup battery for a computer. The flames began in an office space near Faith Chapel — the original worship center — and

our wheels and not really headed in the right direction," Beard told the *Baptist Message*. "Prayer also guided us to put our feet to the ground as we planned and prepared for what God had for us."

Even before he preached his first message of the crusade, Britt said he could feel a spirit of unity among those gathered.

"It was a blessing to see different races, denominations, churches all come together," Britt said. "There were many

decisions for the Lord, and we give Him all the glory."

Now that the crusade has ended, organizers said the real work has begun with follow up calls and visits with those who made decisions. Beard believes many seeds were sown that are not yet evident and is confident more decisions will result in the months ahead.

"During the final night, I told the crowd that I had awakened that morning and thought, 'It is sad to see this come to

an end,'" he said. "But I shared with them that just a second later I realized this is not coming to an end. This is just the beginning of revival. I hope this is the start of area churches coming together for the glory of God. We are on the same team. I hope to see salvations for the weeks ahead. We don't know the full extent of what happened, but the Lord called us to plant the seed. The seed was planted, and He will take care of the rest in the months and years to come."

First Baptist Covington revitalizes Kingdom growth on north, south shores

COVINGTON, La. (LBM) – First Baptist Church in Covington, a beacon of faith for the North Shore, has welcomed a fourth congregation to its growing network of churches.

Members of First Covington voted in the spring and First Baptist Church in Kenner approved the move June 27 to work together in ministry to reach the south shore region of Lake Pontchartrain for Christ. First Kenner, which averages between 175-180 worshippers for Sunday morning services, joins Metairie Church and Metairie Korean Church in this effort. Hope Church in Bush (North Shore) also is part of the growing network.

Waylon Bailey, pastor of FBC Covington, told the *Baptist Message* that this latest partnership will be unique from the others, with FBC Kenner remaining autonomous – meaning it will retain a senior pastor and receive revitalization support from FBCC.

"Our responsibility is

to give forward-thinking leadership, especially as they search for their new pastor and focus on developing new strategies to reach their area for Christ," Bailey said. "We will do our best to do that by emphasizing certain things such as a focus on evangelism, church unity, discipling their people and an emphasis on Scripture."

"It is so easy for a church to turn inward rather than looking outward," he continued. "At First Covington we talk about this all the time. I often say you can't keep people from a place where they are truly loved. You will gravitate toward people who care for you. People then see Jesus in us when do that."

Bailey hopes the partnership will continue building the kingdom of God.

"The only thing this does for us is strengthen churches in the New Orleans area and build the Kingdom of God," he said. "If we can do that, what a legacy we will leave. We need more churches and stronger churches in Covington so when our children go to school, they have more friends with their values. It makes a real difference when you can do that. When churches down the street do well, we generally do well, and vice versa."

Reggie Ogea, interim pastor of First Baptist Kenner, said the partnership will provide valuable guidance and counsel as the church enters this new phase of ministry.

"We are not focusing on the past but are looking to a new future and new beginning," said Ogea, also associate dean of the professional doctoral programs and professor of leadership and pastoral ministry at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. "We are

Former abortionist Abby Johnson to headline 'Gift of Life' banquet

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – During the upcoming CENLA Pregnancy Center 'Gift of Life' Fundraising Banquet, Sept. 14, at the Alexandria Riverfront Center, former Planned Parenthood clinic director Abby Johnson will share her testimony about how she became an outspoken pro-life advocate.

"People will want to hear her story," CPC Director Claire Lemoine told the Baptist Message. "She was on the inside walls of Planned Parenthood for many years and now she is traveling around the country with a power-

ful message. To have her visit central Louisiana is a long-time dream of ours and we can't wait for people to have this rare opportunity."

According to her website, www.abbyj.com, Johnson left Planned Parenthood as a clinic

director after assisting with an ultrasound-guided abortion on Sept. 26, 2009, during which she "watched in horror as a 13-week baby fought for, and ultimately lost, its life at the hand of the abortionist,"

Johnson quickly departed the nation's largest abortion provider, vowing to become an advocate for life inside the womb and to expose the lies of the abortion industry. She has continued sharing her

story around the globe and has helped more than 430 former abortion clinic workers leave the industry through her ministry, And Then There Were None.

The largest fundraiser of the year for the preg-

nancy center also will feature testimonies by pro-life supporters and updates will be presented about how God has used this pro-life ministry to help save central Louisiana babies from abortion.

going to look for someone who has a real calling to go to Kenner which is part of metro New Orleans and on the front end of this will be willing to be all-in. We don't want somebody who is going to see this as an opportunity to go to a different ministry situation but rather are looking for someone who sees this situation as a long-term turnaround. We will trust the Lord that it will be a positive outcome for the Kingdom."

The partnership reflects First Covington's focus on growing a vibrant faith community within the south shore region.

This year, the church recorded 100 professions of faith among 650 children who attended Vacation Bible School. They plan to hold a baptism celebration service over Labor Day weekend.

"The VBS especially energized the church," Bailey said. "We have tried to sell the church on

reaching the next generation and we are making room for them through things like the children's and preschool area buildings that opened a few years ago. Now they are seeing it come to fruition. That gives a quiet confidence we did it right."

His Church makes summer splash with 40 baptisms

PINEVILLE, La. (LBM) – John Sefcik occasionally attended church and some days even read his Bible for the first 49 years of his life, but he had not been “all in” for Jesus, he told the *Baptist Message*.

But the Holy Spirit used a conversation with Kevin Paul, His Church associate pastor, that brought Sefcik under conviction to repent and become a devoted follower of Christ. He publicly shared about his spiritual decision, along with 39 other new converts, during a special baptism service sponsored by His Church, June 6, at Lake Buhlow in Pineville.

“When I look back, I realized God has been pursuing me all my life,” Sefcik said. “I had forgotten about God, then COVID hit and difficult circum-

stances brought me to my knees. The more I got into the Bible and fellowshiped with others, the more my attitude changed about life. I thought I was doing the

right things, but eventually understood what being a Christ follower was all about. I’m glad God didn’t give up on pursuing me all these years.”

MORE GOOD NEWS

For member Gil McKee, baptizing his two sons was an early Father’s Day present.

Both Gabriel, 10, and Caleb, 11, had soaked in biblical truths from him and their mother, Samantha, as

to Christ. And that means every part of our life, including our occupation, no matter what it is."

McCallum was elected to the Louisiana Supreme Court in November and recently served as interim pastor for Liberty Baptist Church near Linville. He is only a few hours shy of completing a master's degree at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, he said, and hopes to graduate in December. He and his wife, Deanna, are members of First Baptist Church in Farmerville, where he is a deacon and teacher and both are active in various ministries, according to his official biography. They are partners in law, too.

McCallum said his journey to the pulpit and the state Supreme Court bench has been guided by the Holy Spirit.

"I am the first person

in my family go to college, much less law school," McCallum explained. "I grew up working in the hay fields in the area and different places."

But his grandfather encouraged him to look at law as a possible career choice, he said.

He added that at a young age he was given the chance to take a leadership role in the Sunday school and Training Union programs of Pisgah Baptist Church, outside of Bernice, also in Union Parish.

"It gave me an opportunity to do speaking within the church and from there outside the church. It seemed like a natural fit to go into law, and I felt like that is where God was calling me. In fact," he continued, "I tried to go into another area. In undergraduate school I tried to set my sights on the medical

profession, but God kept calling me back to training into law."

McCallum said his grandfather, and his parents, each spiritually influenced his life; and they emphasized "we render service to God when we serve our fellow man."

As a result of that influence, he said, "I am always looking for ways that I can get the message out and serve the Lord. I think we must be deliberate in finding ways to do that in our everyday lives. The tools and methods I use may be different than the ones that other people use. But we all need to look for that opportunity."

McCallum underscored his point by sharing that it is not just the pulpit or the judge's bench that give him a platform. He said he began a ministry years ago, handing out bookmarks with 2 Chronicles 7:14 "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray, and

seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from Heaven, and will forgive their sin, and heal their land."

"I have been able to use those effectively as an ice breaker with people with whom I come in contact on a daily basis," McCallum said. "It leads into a lot of Gospel centered conversations. We are on a missionary trip every time we walk out our front doors; and I think as Christians and as Baptists we need to realize that."

As for how his faith informs his judicial duties, McCallum explained that his Christianity "flavors how I approach the bench," especially about fairness. "I think we need to treat people impartially and with respect," he said, drawing upon biblical references about justice for everyone.

His legal philosophy is based on "not creating law" as a judge, but in taking "the law that the people have created through their

elected representatives and senators and applying that to the facts of particular cases," he said. "I think it works best when it works that way."

McCallum said he would encourage Louisiana Baptists that "even in difficult times such as we live in now, God is still sovereign," even in the small things.

"Christ said that the Father knows the number of heads on our head. Not a single sparrow falls to the ground but that the Father ordains it," he referenced from Luke 12:7. "Let God have control of the small problems just like the big problems. In these days submit everything that you have -- all your talents, all your energy, and all your efforts -- to the service of Christ. But also give Him your burdens because He invites that, too. Lean on Him. There is victory in Jesus. So, we should live victorious, abundant lives through Him."

Cajun connection found in 'last frontier' of Alaska

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (LBM) – David Gamble has served as a church planter with the North American Mission Board for the last 10 years in Anchorage, Alaska, but he told the Baptist Message that he is constantly reminded about his roots by the continuing encouragement he receives from his home congregation of Wood Springs Baptist Church in Grand Cane.

Before Gamble and his wife, Kristi, relocated to Alaska, WSBC provided financial support to help the couple prepare for the journey northwest, he said.

Since the couple moved there, WSBC has shipped a trailer for use in the ministry, contributed money to help refurbish a mission hub that teams use while in Anchorage and the nearby

Wasilla area, and mailed or emailed hundreds of notes.

"They encourage us in so many ways," Gamble told the Baptist Message. "We are enjoying our time here and love serving the Lord in Alaska, but there's something special -- even 10 years after moving up here -- when somebody from your home church encourages you. Sometimes you feel alone and forgotten on the mission field, but then we get re-energized when you hear from people in Louisiana who ask how they can pray for you."

The Grand Cane congregation prays for the Gambles and other missionaries before beginning Sunday morning worship services, which draw an average of 25.

They also contribute money to the Gambles as well as missionaries in Mexico and Africa, and last year collected 132 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes

for distribution to children in other countries.

Eva Gamble, a long-time Wood Springs member and a cousin of David Gamble, said praying and contributing money toward missionaries allows them to play a part in Gospel work

taking place in other areas.

"We get to share with David and the others in their ministry and that is something special -- knowing we played some part in someone accepting Christ in

ReGroup offers live, digital discipleship training

WEST MONROE, La. (LBM) – Louisiana Baptists will have two opportunities to refocus and strengthen discipleship efforts during next month's ReGroup events for Sunday school and small group leaders.

ReGroup Conference (live) is scheduled for Aug. 14 at McClendon Baptist Church in West

Monroe, with Digital ReGroup presented on Aug. 16 and 17 in a virtual format. ReGroup events focus on four areas – sharing the Gospel, developing biblical community, helping believers mature spiritually, and equipping believers to live missionally, with special emphasis on maximizing Gospel impact.

When last year's conference was moved from an in-person format to an

all-virtual platform because of concerns brought about by the coronavirus outbreak, it experienced a great response, according to Louisiana Baptist Sunday school/discipleship strategist Sean Keith.

"Obviously, we are excited to offer both live and digital events this year," Keith told the Baptist Message. "ReGroup is the premiere training event for our church lay leaders. Both events will

feature well-known ministry specialists sharing practical, innovative and encouraging approaches to small group health."

Allan Taylor, executive pastor of ministries at First Baptist Church in Concord, Tennessee, will be the keynote speaker for the live conference. Mike Harland, associate pastor of worship at First Baptist Church in Jackson, Mississippi, will serve as worship leader.

Steve Horn, Louisiana Baptist executive director, will host Digital ReGroup. Both conferences will

feature sessions for pastors, Sunday school directors, small group leaders, church staff, preschool, children and youth leaders, discipleship leaders and Bible study leaders.

ReGroup Conference (live) at McClendon Baptist, Aug. 14, will also feature a track for Hispanic pastors and church members.

well as the faithful teaching by extended family and His Church members. The spiritual fruit came to harvest when Caleb repented of his sins and made a commitment to follow Jesus as Lord in April 2020, followed by Gabriel who did the same in April of this year.

"One of the most phenomenal experiences you have is baptizing your own children," McKee said. "You spend years raising your kids and to see them make the ultimate decision to follow Christ, and to be obedient through baptism, is just an amazing feeling."

"There are a lot of decisions your kids make in life, but this is the decision that matters more than any other," he continued. "To see them make it and know you will be together with them forever is more than any dad could want."

HIS Church Pastor Steve Speer said baptizing in the lake brings about a sense of nostalgia from when baptisms in churches and even during biblical times were held many times in that setting, instead of the more traditional baptisms inside a worship center. Since January, His Church has baptized 60 people. If His Church continues this pace, they will surpass their highest ever annual total of 72 baptisms set back in 2016.

"It was an amazing thing to baptize that many people who received Christ," Speer said. "Tears were flowing all around."

"It's such a witness to

get out in the world and be at a place where people are fishing and swimming and enjoy the lake," he continued. "Some of those I would assume are unchurched and they see people make a New Testament statement of faith in baptism. The little boys think it's the greatest thing in the world to get baptized in the lake and the adults like the throwback to how this used to be."

APPEAL TO MILLENNIALS

Since Speer started His Church in 2006, 680 people have been baptized. Additionally, membership has increased from 22 when it first started on July 2, 2006, to 1,549 in mid-June.

The average age of the church membership is 32 years old, and this largely Millennial congregation appreciates nostalgia such as lake and river baptisms, Speer said.

"We have a grace mes-

sage in a Millennial package," he noted. "The grace message is salvation can't be earned but is given only through what Christ has done for us. The mantra of our church is 'His church,' which is Jesus and it's all about Him. A grace message focuses on Him and what He has done for us."

“scramble one more time to accommodate the influx of patients,” he said.

“I am tired of the death and destruction that this is causing, and I have to do something,” Courmier shared. “And so, rather than sitting and going through another fourth surge I have asked permission and have been granted to go across the state trying to convince people that the vaccine is the right thing to do.

“I make no bones about why I am here,” he continued. “I need your help. Some of the most unvaccinated groups are in our own communities, within our churches, who are adamantly opposed to this.”

SAFETY?

Courmier said there is no data to suggest long-term effects will result from vaccination, and he explained that the reason vaccines need special refrigeration was that drug companies took extra efforts to omit preservatives and other stabilizing ingredients that have caused concerns among various groups in the past.

“When the first vaccine came out, there was an almost immediate push-back because of the already debunked idea of certain ingredients causing autism.”

He said scientists were so sensitive about such anti-vaccination responses that

they took special care in formulating the vaccines.

“There is absolutely nothing in there that can even potentially harm you,” he said.

LONG-TERM EFFECTS?

Courmier said that obviously there is no data on which to assess the long-term effects, but he pointed to the extended records of other vaccines to state there was no likely potential for the vaccine to create health problems later in life.

“We can’t know, and that’s kind of an issue,” he conceded. “But what vaccine, that has been created so far, has long-term effects? In other words ... when we take a tetanus shot or MMR [measles, mumps, rubella vaccine] ... 50 years later you have a heart attack, are we

going to say that was attributed to the MMR?”

He added that most physicians and scientists believe that if you are going to have an adverse reaction to any vaccination, it will happen in the first four weeks after having taken that shot.

WHY VACCINATE?

Courmier responded to a question about the low mortality rate of COVID-19, 1.8 percent (meaning a 98.2 percent survivability), and why vaccinations are needed at all.

“Assuming no vaccinations, with 1.8 percent mortality, that’s 5 million Americans dead,” he said, pointing out “that’s more than the [population] of the entire state of Louisiana.”

Flames event when he was 25 years old and four years later accepted the call to vocational ministry.

"I had recognized as a young man that I had allowed the world to get

in the way of my relationship with the Lord," Sheridan said. "I chased financial success but found myself convicted that there was more to this life. Since I made that commitment at 25, I

have been fully sold out to Christ ever since."

During the years that followed, Sheridan served as interim pastor of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church in Bogalusa, and pastor of Plainview Baptist Church in Bogalusa, First Baptist Church in Pine Prairie and Lee's Creek Baptist.

Sheridan remained active in associational life: He was moderator of Mt. Olive Baptist Association; and served as pastors conference chairman for Washington Baptist Association, one of three BASELA associations (Two Rivers and William Wallace also are members).

He also was a member of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board, served as a Re-Group Sunday school training conference consultant and was named to the President's 2020 Commission, which, in

2013, developed 10 statewide objectives for reaching Louisiana with the Gospel by 2020.

Sheridan, a native of Gulfport, Mississippi, is a graduate of Louisiana State University and New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He and his wife, Suzanne, have three children and one grandchild.

A top priority for Sheridan will be leading the association's 96 churches to a deeper involvement in missions at every level.

Lawmakers defect, Fairness in Women's Sports fails

BATON ROUGE, La. (LBM) – A critical bill that would have prevented biological males (as transgender women) from taking women's sports team spots away from biological females was defeated, July 21, during a veto override session in the Louisiana House, when 10 representatives either defected or did not vote after having previously supported the legislation in the regular session.

Sen. Beth Mizell (R), Senate president pro tem-

pore and a member of First Baptist Church, Franklinton, authored S.B. 156 "Fairness in Women's Sports Act" as an attempt to level the playing field for women athletes. The bill was a response against the H.R. 5 "Equality Act" submitted in the U.S. Congress that would allow biological males to compete as females. It was passed at the federal level by the House and is awaiting a vote in the Senate. However, an executive mandate promoting transgender rights by President Joe Biden (D) calls for a review of federal policies that likely will produce

the same result as passage of H.R. 5.

REGULAR SESSION

In the spring, the Louisiana Senate passed Mizell's measure to guard against males on female teams, 29-6-4, and the House, too, 78-19-8. However, Gov. John Bel Edwards (D) vetoed S.B. 156, causing an uproar among the faith community across the state, leading to the historic override session.

OVERRIDE SESSION

In the Senate, Mizell urged members who had previously supported the bill to stand firm.

"On May 6, we voted for S.B. 156 because we believed overwhelmingly that competition in women's sports deserved protection. We did that with no prodding, no carrots, no sticks and not even sugar," an apparent reference to the political pressure brought to bear on legislatures by opponents to

the bill.

Mizell also mentioned the support garnered from the school superintendents around the state as well as the sports governing body, the Louisiana High School Athletic Association.

In the end, two-thirds of the senators voted to override the governor's veto, 26-12-1, sending the measure to the House.

Four senators did not vote for the bill the second time: Regina Barrow (D), Katrina Jackson (D), Gary Smith (D), and Gregory Tarver (D).

Sen. Mike Fesi (R), who was absent during the spring vote, voted in favor of S.B. 156 during the override session and even spoke in support of it from the floor.

In the House, Rep. Laura Schlegel (R) presented the bill for a vote, also underscoring the need to protect female athletes' rights, which are enshrined in Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972.

"It's simply about one thing: fairness in women's

sports," she said, adding that during the regular session the bill "passed overwhelmingly with 78 votes from both Democrats and Republicans with 50 coauthors."

She also pointed out that it was the overwhelming response of Louisiana citizens' support of the bill that prompted lawmakers to call for the historic veto override session.

In the end, however, the vote was 68-30-6, two votes short of the super majority needed to override the governor's veto.

Seven House members abandoned their previous positions and voted against the Fairness in Women's Sports Act: Roy Daryl Adams (I), Chad Brown (D), Robby Carter (D), Mack Courmier (D), Travis Johnson (D), Jeremy LaCombe (D), and Pat Moore (D).

Three representatives who voted for S.B. 156 the first time were absent from the veto override session: Wilford Carter (D), Kenny Cox (D), and Malinda White (I).

Plagiarism scandal embroils SBC President Ed Litton

WASHINGTON (LBM) – National media outlets such as the *Washington Times* and *Newsweek* have reported a plagiarism scandal involving Ed Litton, pastor of Redemption Church in Saraland, Alabama, and newly elected president of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Now, the Conservative Baptist Network, with a membership of 10,000 pastors and other church leaders, has issued a statement calling for Litton to resign.

REPORTS

The controversy erupted with an anonymous posting, June 24, of a comparison of sermons preached by Litton and J.D. Greear, pastor of The Summit Church in Raleigh, North Carolina, and immediate past SBC president. The video montage shows several segments where Litton repeats word-for-word from different portions of a sermon on Romans first preached by Greear.

Questions also have been raised about the theology presented in the sermons, which claim that God only "whispers" against sexual sin such as homosexuality.

The fallout has been broad, with other media outlets following up with subsequent reports of pla-

giarism by Litton.

Meanwhile, *Newsweek* reported, June 28, that "more than 140 videos were either unavailable or hidden across several playlists on the Redemption Church YouTube page" after Litton "came under fire."

Redemption Church released a statement, June 28, to *Baptist Press*, explaining that "we have taken down sermon series prior to 2020 because people were going through sermons in an attempt to discredit and malign our pastor."


RESPONSES

Greear released a statement detailing that Litton had requested to use the sermon and had been given permission. Greear also explained away similarities of a personal missionary anecdote he used in the sermon that seemed to mimic a personal missionary anecdote by Paul Tripp, a "pastor, event speaker, and a best-selling and award-winning author," according to www.paultripp.com.

Greear also shared that he had borrowed the "whispers" concept from one of his "favorite Bible teachers," Jen Wilken, and that "She was quoting from the late RC Sproul in his book *What's In the Bible?*, co-authored with Robert Wolgemuth, in their chapter

another state or country," she said. "We are gung-ho on missions. Souls get saved and that's the ultimate reason why we do what we do anyway."

Gamble was raised in DeSoto Parish and worked as an engineer before he and his wife surrendered to mission

work in Alaska. He started Sand Lake Fellowship in Anchorage in 2013 and expanded his ministry in 2018 to include a facility that houses mission teams.

Sand Lake Fellowship, which was averaging 35 people before the pandemic, recently began meeting with the congregation of the First Baptist Church in Anchorage, which drew 30 for Sunday morning worship services in March 2020. Since they began meeting together for services, attendance has increased to an average of 90, including a high of 111 for Easter.

Gamble said he is excited about how God will use his church and the mission house and invites Louisiana Baptists to join him in reaching those in the Great Frontier for Christ: "Come join us and be a part of what God is doing here."

spread quickly to the attic and other buildings including the childcare center and various youth facilities. About 65 firefighters fought the blaze, finally extinguishing it about 3:30 p.m. that same day.

Only the worship center, Tiny Town preschool area and some of the administrative offices were not damaged.

Rather than fold, the church rallied and chose to rise above the ashes.

The congregation held a meeting in the Bossier Civic Center two days later to pray, worship and organize for recovery, and then gathered Dec. 16, 2018, to look ahead to the future during the first Sunday morning worship service after the fire.

Once construction plans were finalized, a groundbreaking ceremony was held Sept. 29, 2019.

Jurkovich offered that, early on, the thought of rebuilding so much of the campus was overwhelming to him, but he knew God would give the church strength to persevere.

"You can sit there

with any strategy when it strikes and be overwhelmed and you feel that on a thousand different levels," he said. "As a pastor you go 'Lord will we hang tough, fight through this and persevere.' I am so thankful he gave us a spirit of courage and commitment. It would have been so easy to give up, especially after we were dealt another blow with the pandemic.

"Even in the midst of all this, the Lord put things in front of us that are pretty cool," he continued. "I am proud of our staff team for standing strong, I am proud of our church leadership for keeping the faith. During the pandemic we could have been scared but we knew God provided the finances and the moment."

CONTINUED BLESSINGS

In the last few months alone, Jurkovich said, God has moved powerfully through First Bossier:

-- During the last week in June, 13 students stepped forward at a beach

camp for baptism, and 22 new believers were baptized during the worship service on campus.

-- A month before that, former New Orleans Saint quarterback Drew Brees, a devout Christian, signed a partnership with First Bossier's sports outreach to bring a flag football league to its Freedom Fields, with an anticipated September kickoff. His "Football 'N'America" league has 23 locations around the nation, including First Bossier.

-- The campus hosted more than 4,000 people for an annual "Eggstravaganza" celebration for Easter, and another 5,000 folks showed up for a fireworks event the Sunday night before Memorial Day to kick-off the summer.

"You could tell that even in the midst of a rebuild there are just connecting points happening as a ministry to reach people for Christ and strengthen the church," Jurkovich said. "This is what we are about and after what we went through two-and-a-half years, it has all been very encouraging."

on creation."

For his part, Litton issued a statement, dated "yesterday," explaining that he decided to use Greear's work after consulting with his eight-man sermon preparation team.

"In that process, I learned about my friend J.D. Greear's messages on Romans and discovered what he had recently preached resonated with the direction God was leading me and our preaching team. We often consulted his manuscripts along with other resources as we prepared," he wrote.

"With his permission, I borrowed some of his insights" as well as "three closing points," he stated. He also said the missionary anecdote he used was not Greear's, but Tripp's from "his devotional New Morning Mercies on January 22nd. His story took place in India."

REACTION

The Conservative Baptist Network, which describes itself as a "broad-based grassroots movement of Southern Baptists of all generations who are committed to the sufficiency of Scripture," issued a statement, July 20, calling the "repeated plagiarism of multiple sources" by Litton "sinful behavior."

"The Conservative Baptist Network delayed commenting on this matter publicly in the hope that personal conversations and counsel with President Litton would lead him to acknowledge his error and repent" the statement reads. "Sadly, this has not occurred."

The group called for "the leaders of the SBC to address this matter promptly and biblically" and for Litton "to step down from office and focus on his personal spiritual development with his local church."

BEST VACCINE?

The benefit of all three vaccines exceeds the risk, Courmier told the group.

"However, if you have a choice, and most people do, I would not choose the J&J" [Johnson & Johnson vaccine], he offered, citing a 1 in 750,000 chance of a blood clot. But he also emphasized that "you are much, much, much, much more likely to get a blood clot from some of the other medications that we take."

PRO-LIFE CONCERNS?

According to the CDC, three COVID-19 vaccines are approved for use in the United States: Pfizer (ages 12 and older); Moderna (ages 18 and older); and Johnson & Johnson (ages 18 and older).

The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were produced without use of federal human fetal stem cell lines (two lines were developed from aborted babies, one in 1972 and another in 1985). However,

some safety testing of these two vaccines used the tissue cloned from these aborted babies. Johnson & Johnson, on the other hand, used the cloned tissue in the design and development, production, and testing of its vaccine.

"We're not promoting abortion. We're not precipitating more abortions for the purposes of research," Courmier said.

"We have the issue of using something bad and creating something that's saving a whole lot of lives," he said. "In some sense, redeeming that abortion."

VARIANTS

Courmier took questions about vaccinated people getting infected by new COVID-19 variants and vaccinations for people who have the antibodies from having recovered from the virus. "So far, even if you get infected with the vaccine, most people don't require hospitalization," he said, remarking that symptoms are less severe

for people who have been vaccinated and get infected with COVID-19.

Additionally, the vaccine "protects you against repeated infections," he said.

Similarly, Courmier said those who have the antibodies from having recovered from COVID-19 are better protected by being vaccinated. He described the advantage as "an obvious, and much more robust antibody production when you are infected and then you get the vaccine, than infected alone."

YOUNG ADULTS, CHILDREN

Courmier said the vaccines do not affect the fertility of women and that it is "scientifically impossible" for the vaccines to alter DNA, in response to questions about the vaccine's impact on college-age adults.

He further commented about the upcoming academic year and vaccinations for adolescents (12-year-olds, plus, were approved for vaccinations in May).

"I have very strong recommendations and encouragements that adults get the

vaccines," Courmier stated. Although he does advocate for 12-17-year-olds to get the vaccinations, he said "it's not as strong" an endorsement.

"I think if every adult got it, you could achieve a sufficient herd immunity that the children would get colds and they would get over it and you would be fine," he said. "But we can't do that. I don't think it's going to happen. I would like to think it would, but the reality is it's probably not."

"So, we are going to have to figure about another way to achieve herd immunity and part of the way is to vaccinate our children so that when they go to grandparents that aren't vaccinated, they will stay safe," he reasoned. "And they go back to their homes with parents that don't want to vaccinate, they stay safe. And neighbors stay safe and so forth. I do advocate for it."

OTHER THOUGHTS

Courmier said the context for making his personal appeal to Christians around the state was that "we are the people that embrace truth. I

just want to make sure that you understand that if you say no to the vaccine, I am okay with that -- as long as you are saying 'no' for the right reasons. If you are saying 'no' because of all the false and wrong reasons, that is horrible to me. At least make an informed reason and that is why I am here today."

In his closing remarks, Louisiana Baptist Executive Director Steve Horn encouraged others to get the vaccine.

"For what it's worth to my staff, I hope you will think incredibly seriously about getting the vaccination for all the reasons stated today," he said. "I have a 10-year-old that can't get the shot and I want him to be as safe as possible."

"And also, my argument would be, I just have come to believe it's the right thing to do," Horn said. "You have to make up your mind, but I agree what with Dr. Courmier has said. If you come at it a different way, at least come at it from a situation that is based on things that are true, not on things that are rhetoric or fiction."
