## **EVANGELISM 101 (Part 4): Special Cases**

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – The focus of the Gospel conversation must prioritize eternal redemption – salvation – to the lost. However, it is often the case that a person brings other needs into the conversation that are important to hear and, in some cases, demand immediate action.

Baptist churches record, on average, 25 percent of their annual baptisms because of Vacation Bible School, so it is fitting to start this discussion about special cases by addressing some considerations when Gospel counseling children. Even more so, Christ declared that every person must come to Him "as a little child" to enter the Kingdom of Heaven (Mt. 18:3; Lk. 18:17). Consequently, pointers about counseling children apply whether that child is five or 95.

# Rolling Hills Ministries: 100th person earns equivalency diploma

RUSTON, La. (LBM) – Rolling Hills Ministries recently celebrated the 100th person to earn a high school equivalency diploma through its ministry.

Chelsey Cole, director of RHM's HiSET (High School Equivalency Test) program, said the milestone is a reminder that it

is never too late for someone to begin again.

"It is very rewarding to see some students come in with such low confidence and come out with a life transformation," Cole told the Baptist Message. "When they walk across the stage and get their diploma, it's such a magical moment."

Started in 2017, the program holds weekly classes at thrift stores in Bossier City and Monroe and at First Baptist in Ruston. While students have up to 36 weeks to prepare for their HiSET, some students finish much earlier. Once they pass the exam, students are given a Bible and a \$500 scholarship to use toward continuing education.

RHM uses a portion of proceeds inside the "education" section of their thrift stores to fund the program. Churches donate additional classroom space and food.

## Unified: Two Jena churches merge to create a brighter beacon

JENA, La. (LBM) – Bellevue Baptist Church was at a crossroads in 2024, when their weekly attendance was growing to near capacity for Sunday morning worship.

After months of seeking the Holy Spirit's direction, Pastor Dustin Robertson learned that East Jena Baptist Church's attendance had dwindled, and that they were open to discussions about another church using their spaces.

Following meetings in early 2025, 29 members from East Jena Baptist and 59 from Bellevue Baptist unanimously voted, April 6, to become one congregation called Eastvue Baptist Church, creating a strong and dynamic body focused on reaching a community ripe for harvest.

"When we came together, the people of East Jena were needing us just as much as we needed the facilities of East Jena," Robertson told the Baptist Message. "This became about ministering to one another and that unity sealed the deal for us to join.

"We live in a world where families, communities and even churches can become divided," he continued. "I hope this sets an example for other churches to know they, too, can experience unity, whether it's to merge or just to reach their community for Christ."

Robertson became pastor of Bellevue Baptist in November 2024, when the church averaged 85-100 in Sunday worship and had few empty seats in the worship center, limiting growth. The church explored the possibility of raising money to build a new facility but felt God had other plans.

At the same time, East Jena Baptist's attendance had decreased from 125 in 2020 to 40 in 2024. Their worship facility could accommodate 500, leaving much empty space.

In early 2025, Robertson and East Jena Baptist Pastor Michael Wilkinson, along with other leaders from both churches, held conversations about moving forward in the community and realized their need to merge. After several meetings the churches voted to fuse their ministries, and now Robertson serves as pastor and Wilkinson as associate pastor.

"East Jena, like many churches, had gone through phases of decline," said Wilkinson, who recently was named associational mission strategist for LaSalle Baptist Association. "If you're familiar with Jena, there are more than enough churches to choose from. When we met together, we ended up finding out that our vision about ministry was very compatible.

"After that first meeting between both churches, you could literally feel the Spirit of the Lord moving among all of us," he continued. "And there was unbelievable humbleness on both sides. We didn't want our doors to close, and if that meant we needed to step aside, we were for it."

### REACHING JENA TOGETHER

The two former congregations complement one another, Wilkinson and Robertson said.

Since the merger, they have held a commissioning service, April 13, and have numerous events planned that include a baptism, Vacation Bible School and youth trip.

"We have shown our community that two churches can merge," Wilkinson said. "We believe by faith and trust in the Lord that we're hoping to set a model, not just for churches in our area but in our state and country.

"There are a lot of churches that are struggling and have good people serving in them," he continued. "I think there are a lot of churches that might want to pray and consider consolidating or merging because there is a lack of pastors, and sometimes churches are struggling financially. Bellevue could have easily spent millions of dollars on property and buildings but now we have a new church that can use that money for missions. We just think the Kingdom is better served with that money going into winning the lost instead of buying more property and building more buildings. We're just tickled pink and are looking forward to what the Lord's going to do."

way – through the Son (John 14:6). There is one plan of salvation. However, explaining that plan might need to take into account a number of considerations -- even about our choice of words - so that every individual may understand.

With children, particularly, it is important to put them at ease. Make sure that both of you are sitting so that there is a relatively level eye contact (preferably across from each other). Also, be sure to have someone else present, ideally a parent – but give the child your full attention (don't look at the parent for an answer nor to carry the conversation).

Use open-ended questions that avoid a "yes" or "no" response. Do not ask "pat" questions that have "canned" answers. You are seeking authentic reactions that reflect a true sense of the child's heart.

The child may use words and phrases that fit his or her level of development, but regardless should be able to tell you about God's perfect plan (that all men would live with Him in Heaven, 1 Pet. 3:9), our imperfection (sin, Rom. 3:23), the consequences of disobedience (spiritual death, Rom. 6:23a), His provision for our eternity (Jn. 3:16, Rom. 5:8), and the steps to receive salvation (heartfelt belief and public profession, Rom. 10:9-10).

Some might better understand salvation as a "gift" (Rom. 6:23b) and the step to receive it (via our faith, Eph. 2:8).

Do not expect a seminary-trained explanation but instead listen for a simple heartfelt expression of belief in Jesus as Lord, thankfulness for His forgiveness of sin, and a willingness to follow Him and profess Him to others.

Some specific issues for awareness, include separation anxiety (Mom & Dad are saved and the child wants to be sure to be with them in Heaven); camaraderie (sibling or a friend were saved, and they want to be like them); and sadness for doing something wrong but not godly grief (2 Cor. 7:10).

These are not expressions of repentance to salvation. But such feelings do give you the opportunity to begin an intentional discussion that may lead them to salvation.

For comparison: In adults, "fire insurance" might be a motivation.

### **ABUSE OR SUICIDE**

It is critcially important when someone mentions abuse (receiving or committing, including sexual grooming) -- wherever it occurs (home, school church, recreation ) -that the counselor listens first (be compassionate) and then immediately takes steps to protect the victim (without alerting the abuser.

There are many possible situations, but as a rule of thumb, do all of the following: Contact close family members (who are not the abuser), an authority who supervises the abuser, and the local jurisdiction for law enforcement (must always be done).

Likewise, the victim (such as an abused spouse) might need an immediate safe harbor, and it is important to find a ministry or social service provider that can offer a temporary place to stay -- now. Do not allow a victim to return to a situation of potential abuse.

Regarding suicide or selfharm, listen compassionately and notify others who need to know (parents, spouses, pastors, school officials, etc.). Moreover, do not presume that your conversation with this individual has resolved the mental disorder or social situation that is the root of the desperation that the person is experiencing. Instead, take the person to the local emergency room for an immediate evaluation (if the counselee is a minor, get the parent involved). Then, find a Christian counseling ministry that can take this person as a long-term patient.

Importantly, in both cases (abuse and suicide / self-harm), do not neglect the Gospel conversation.


The earthly factors that are

mitment to starting and nurturing churches as a missionary to Asia and Europe (Acts 13-14; 15:36-18:22; 18:23-21:16).

Remember, you are not the appointing authority, that is the role of the church body. However, you will be offering your observation of the person to the congregation. So, you should ask some key questions.

First, have the person describe his salvation experience (do not presume anyone is saved and always discuss or present the Gospel plan of salvation). Then see if the person has a history of teaching.

Paul indicated the only difference between the qualifications for the office of bishop and the office of deacons was that the man must be "apt to teach" (1 Tim. 3:2). Has he taught a Sunday school class or other small group, or been a VBS teacher? If not, suggest that he start his response to the call to the ministry by taking on a teaching role.

**Missionary** Always ask the person to describe his or her salvation experience. This is the first qualification that must be met to serve in the mission field.

But also find out what they have done in the past that might indicate there is a fit with being a missionary. Has the person served with backyard VBS efforts? What about mission trips in the local area or to other states? Has he or she ever been on a short-term mission trip abroad?

### ASSURANCE

A Christian may experience godly grief multiple times throughout her or his life. The first time leads to repentance for salvation, and subsequent times lead to repentance for restoration. We must repent to turn to Christ, and we must repent to return to Him.

When a person comes forward questioning their salvation, do not assume they are saved. Engage them with the plan of salvation. If they are under the leadership of the Holy

Spirit, this conversation will help them with assurance of their salvation.

If they are saved, you may need only to remind them that we who believe are sealed by the power of the Holy Spirit who is the guarantor of our salvation (Eph. 1: 13-14). Moreover, when we receive Him, believing in His name, we become His children (John 1:12) – an adoption that is irrevocable (John 6:39-40; 10:27-30).

### **BAPTISM**

The Great Commission

EGENDS

(Mt. 28:18-20) instructs us to evangelize (lead someone to saving knowledge of Christ), baptize (mentor the new believer to take this step of obedience) and teach (help the Christian mature in his or her walk with Christ).

Baptism is a step that follows salvation, it is an act of obedience (Mt. 10:32-33) that is not a part of salvation (Eph. 2:9). It is a portrayal of the Gospel, describing Christ's death, burial and resurrection through us (1 Cor. 15:1-4). Moreover, we are called to follow Christ,

and we must imitate His example, including being baptized (Mt. 3:13-15).

Importantly, baptism should result only after understanding its importance. But it should not be delayed (Acts 16:31-33). Remember, baptism is not essential for salvation, but it is essential for obedience.

We join the Kingdom through salvation. However, we join the fellowship of His family via baptism (Acts 2:41).

### **CHRISTIAN MATURITY**

Our lives in Christ are meant to be part of a sanctification process. Sanctification is both an event, but it also is an ongoing development of health and growth in Christ.

Jacob is a great example of both points. He was set apart for God at a specific point in his life (Gen. 28:14) and he was changed through his obedience during his many life experiences to the point that God changed his name (Gen. 32:27-31, "Jacob" translates" as "supplant-er," meaning Jacob supplanted God's will with his own; "Israel" literally means "God prevails" to convey that God rules the man who once supplanted

### His will).

There are daily steps to spiritual health and growth that every believer needs: prayer (build your relationship with Him); Bible study (know His character and the nature of the relationship He wants with you); worship (Rev. 4:6-11; Heb. 10:25 -- simply honor Him); fellowship (build relationships with other believers to sustain your spiritual health and growth); and discipling others (as you grow, witness to the lost and mentor the spiritually young).

of what takes place at the retreat are not disclosed, the men get to celebrate their commitments to Christ at the end in front of family, friends and the congregation. The number of baptisms vary from three to 17 after each retreat.

Once the retreat concludes, they are plugged into one of the 25 men's discipleship groups who meet at various times throughout the week for Bible study and accountability to sharpen and encourage one another to grow in Christ.

"We don't dunk them and leave them where they are," McPherson said. "We try to pull them through the discipleship process. Getting involved inspires them to one day teach others." Gavin Rawls is among the men touched by the Holy Spirit and baptized. After dismissing several invitations from a friend to attend previous retreats, Rawls finally conceded and signed up. Though he went in without much knowledge of Jesus or the church, Rawls left with a


Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. She and her husband, Joshua, have one child, Emma, 14.

families who need us,' and we don't have to look very far for the answer," Hancock told the crowd "It's right here in our community, and it's all across the state. So, the Compassion Center will be here to meet physical needs, to build trust, to be able to share the Gospel and to give an unconditional love of Jesus."

LBCHFM President and CEO Perry Hancock recognized two families whose mothers donated a large amount of money to make the Compassion Center a reality: Mary Gallaspy and Susan Potter, both who have since passed away. Whit Gallaspy, one of Mary Gallaspy's sons, noted that his mother had a heart for those like the ones served by the Compassion Center.

"What an exciting thing this is," he said. "I just want to run around the block singing.

"Will there be after-effects of this ministry," he continued. "Will there be things like improved academic performances?

How about less substance abuse, less problems with things like alcohol in Monroe? Wouldn't that be huge? And I look forward to hopefully seeing some of this. And I know you do too."

Perry Hancock shared about Potter, whose family was unable to attend the ceremony.

Potter previously funded construction of apartments for homeless women and their children on the LBCHFM campus and prior to the 2023 dedication of those facilities she asked Hancock about the next project on the horizon. Hancock then showed her a conceptual drawing of the Compassion Center, which at the time still was a dream.

"It was just a matter of a few weeks that she made an incredible gift that made this facility possible," Hancock said. "And when I think of her, I actually think of women who have that kind of heart, particularly for children. And because of these two wonderful women, they have a legacy of their own compassion. But it's a legacy of lives that are going to be changed by the power of the Lord our God."

"Pray first of all that we can get some relief to the 27 graduates so they can help other people as well," he continued. "And pray that God will open the people's hearts to the Gospel during this time of devastation."

Springs Baptist Camp in Pelican, resulted in 11 men coming to Christ and later being baptized in their home churches.

CENLA women recently completed a retreat, April 2-4, at Clara Springs where 17 women surrendered their lives to Jesus.

For the past two years, retreat ministry leaders have hosted men's and women's events in the spring and fall at Camp Grant Walker and Clara Springs, respectively.

The Franklin Parish Retreat was established as a ministry on Feb. 9, 2023, and that event birthed the CENLA Retreat ministry, which hosted its first event in April 2023. Since those original events, both ministries have hosted five retreats for men and five for women, catalyzing obvious changes in their respective communities.

The original retreat in Franklin Parish sparked a revival that has continued to this day, as the participants have reported growth in their congregations and significant increases in the number of people coming to Christ through salvation, church homes, we look at their Kelly said.

The CENLA retreat ministry has recorded more than 75 bap-

the ministry has impacted many throughout central Louisiana, and it is not uncommon for more than 30 churches of various denominations to have members attend a retreat at one time.

"Over the past two years, many have come to Christ through the efforts of the volunteers, commonly referred to as 'teamers' in addition to those who have repented and began to walk in Christ. Marriages have been restored, and church attendance has increased as men and women realized they were created for a purpose in the Kingdom of God," Kelly said.

### **CELEBRATING COMMITMENTS**

While most of the details of what takes place at the retreat are not disclosed, the men and women do get to celebrate their commitments to Christ at the end with baptism either at the camp or by their home church.

"For those who do not have address and try to link them up with a Bible believing and teaching church or have one of tisms of men and women. Kelly said the teamers invite them to attend church with them," Kelly said. "The goal after the retreat experience has ended is to plug them in a church so they can begin the discipleship and sanctification process." As Jamie Slade from Franklin Parish always says, "Just give us one more Lord for the Kingdom."

'God does not call men or women to stay on the sidelines, but to get in the game of life. No football coach ever schemed against the players on the bench, and neither does Satan. If that is you as a Christian, you are right where he wants you to be. We are trying to encourage guys and gals to take that next step," he continued. "I thank the Lord Jesus every day for Franklin Parish taking that step of faith with their first retreat and that Philip Robertson saw

the potential in this ministry and gave us the 'green light' to attend as guests and then establish the CENLA Retreat Ministry."

Robertson, pastor of Philadelphia Baptist Church in Deville, echoed the far-reaching impact of the retreat.

I have never seen a man or woman from Philadelphia Baptist Church attend a CENLA retreat





# North Monroe men's retreat is a time of soul winning

The number of baptisms vary from three to 17 after each retreat.

Brett Rodriguez, who teaches a fellowship group, said his members were so impacted by the conference that they spent their allotted time the next Sunday discussing what had happened to them and others.
