Special needs son impacted FBCC special needs ministry

COVINGTON, La. (LBM) – Will Robinson was a young man of few words but his impact on those he encountered was immeasurable.

Robinson, who died,

June 7, at age 24, was born without the ability to speak. Still, his parents refused to let that stop him from living life to its fullest. In turn that mindset led to the creation, two years after his birth, of the “Special Friends Ministry” to individuals with special

needs and their families with First Baptist Church, Covington.

Glynn Robinson, who serves as missions and evangelism pastor with FBCC, said he and his wife, Melinda, miss their son, but are thankful for the joy he brought to their family

and community.

“There’s no way to physically account for it, but you just give God the glory because He is always drawing people and used a guy like Will and our family,” Glynn Robinson told the *Baptist Message*. “We now have to keep honoring

that legacy and God will show us a very clear pathway forward.”

While the Special Friends Ministry officially began in 2003, the church already ministered to families of children with special

EVANGELISM 101 (Part 7): Reach the world from LA with technology

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) -- Technology has erased borders, and the Great Commission has never been more within the world’s reach.

You can sit in your living room on a Tuesday evening and reach 100 people for Christ. The next day, from your home office, you can preach to 30,000 people gathered in a town halfway around the world. It sounds impossible, but these are realities that I have experienced firsthand and taught others to embrace.

Yet few are seizing this opportunity.

LBC BCM members share Gospel globally

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – The world was a summertime mission field for 245 students from the state’s Baptist Collegiate Ministries.

From serving at Tall Timbers Baptist Conference Center, in Vacation Bible School with Louisiana Baptist churches and a camp in Wyoming to working overseas alongside International Mission Board missionaries in Chile, Mexico, Switzerland, the United Kingdom and other undisclosed locations due to security concerns, the students relied on the Lord to help them be His hands and feet.

“Through serving, students not only discover but

2025 Louisiana legislative wrap-up

BATON ROUGE, La. (LBM) – Louisiana Baptists can celebrate multiple victories on key moral issues and social concerns resulting from measures that were passed or defeated

during the 2025 Legislative Regular Session, with two directly impacting churches’ abilities to carry out essential ministries.

CHURCH INSURANCE

When Gov. Landry signed HB460 into law

as Act 461 on June 23, he completed the legislative process for supplemental appropriations that include payment of \$2.9 million to the Fellowship of Louisiana Churches and Non-profit Religious Organiza-

Digital Evangelism is Powerful

Fifty years ago, my friend Wade Akins and I came to know each other because of our connections to Louisiana College (Louisiana Christian University) -- a friendship that would span decades of ministry around the world.

More recently, when Wade heard about my "Skype Evangelism" efforts, he called asking, "Can you teach me?" So, during his visit to San Antonio, I showed him how to use his cell

phone to connect with the world and share the Gospel.

The results were overwhelming.

Wade began reaching thousands of people and training others to do the same, including Pastor Truman Herring, another Louisiana native and the first person to ever share the Gospel with me. Now Truman preaches around the world almost daily, seeing thousands come to Christ from his home in Georgia.

I have personally witnessed God use this approach to plant churches in villages where no Christians previously existed, conduct mass evangelistic events with tens of thousands in attendance, and disciple

new believers across continents.

The harvest is ready, and the technology is in your hands!

Getting Started

Step 1: Build Relationships. Do not just broadcast "in the dark" -- make connections overseas. Global digital evangelism thrives on authentic relationships with in-country leaders who share your heart for the lost. Even as I write this, a Southern Baptist pastor of Indian descent from Ohio is in India, fresh from our Digital Bible Institute training, and is showing churches how to partner for evangelistic outreach.

Step 2: Master Basic Technology. Do not let technology intimidate you. I began when an Indian pastor I had mentored asked for help in discipling new believers in his congregation. We used Skype -- he connected a television to his computer, and I spent several days teaching and discipling remotely. Then he asked me to conduct an evangelistic meeting. So, the new believers I had just trained took what they had just learned and invited people to the meeting. We saw about 100 people come to Christ, most of whom joined my friend's church. Since then, I have used various platforms -- WhatsApp, Skype, Facebook, and others -- to reach people in homes and large outdoor gatherings. The platform matters less than the heart behind it.

Step 3: Gather Your Equipment. You need surprisingly little to start: -- high-speed internet

connection (you may need to fund a one-month connection for your in-country partner); -- smartphone, tablet, or computer (on your end);

-- in-country partner with basic tech skills; -- (for larger events) a projector, screen, and sound system (on their end); and -- (optional) wireless lapel microphone for clearer audio.

Step 4: Start Small, Dream Big. Begin with home meetings or small gatherings organized by your partner in that country. I have conducted intimate meetings in living rooms and massive outdoor events with equal effectiveness. Remember that the size of the audience does not determine the size of the harvest -- God does.

Prayer is Essential

Any attempt to reach people with the Gospel must be saturated in

prayer. We must speak in the power of the Holy Spirit, never becoming dependent on technology alone. Technology is merely a tool, effective only as it is wielded in the power of God's Spirit. Also, Satan will do everything possible to hinder the Gospel from going beyond your church or community. Thus, prayer is not optional -- it is critical, especially when using technology. So, pray! Pray! And pray more!

Global Mission Field Awaits

The Great Commission has never been more achievable -- from your kitchen table, you can reach the unreached, and from your church office, you can plant churches on continents you have never visited. The question, then, is not whether you have the means but whether you have the heart.

The Gospel is the

hope of the world, and today, you can take it further than you ever imagined--without leaving your home.

Will you answer the call?

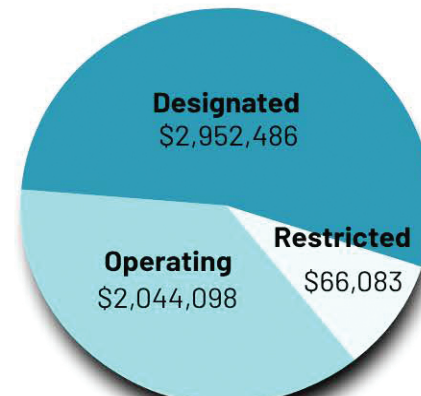

"We have audited the accompanying financial statements of [the] Louisiana Baptist Foundation, Alexandria, Louisiana (a nonprofit corporation), which comprises the statements of financial position as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows -- operating activities for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of [the] Louisiana Baptist Foundation as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America."

tions, the corporation that was established in 2023 to launch a church self-insurance program in response to the church insurance crisis in the state.

FLCNRO is recognized as a nonprofit by the Louisiana secretary of state and the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, and its board of directors includes leaders in six state faith communities (Assemblies of God; Church of God in Christ; Home and Foreign Missions Baptist; Louisiana Baptist; Missionary Baptist; United Pentecostal). When the insurance program is launched it will be open to congregations of any Louisiana denomination as well as religious nonprofits.

Several Louisiana Baptist lawmakers were critical to securing these one-time funds for the church self-insurance start up: Rep. Julie Emerson (member, First Lafayette), chair, House Ways and Means Committee; Gabe Firment (deacon, First Pollock), chair, House Insurance Committee; and Jack McFarland (member, Caney Lake, Chatham), chair, House Appropriations Committee and author of HB460.

MINISTRY PROTECTIONS

Rep. Beryl Amedee, a member of the legislature's Freedom Caucus, championed HB371 to ensure that churches face no stricter regulations than the least restrictive rules applied to secular businesses. The measure was drafted largely in response to bureaucratic red tape which had

prohibited Ridge Avenue Baptist Church in West Monroe from opening its children's building to outside groups such as Mother's Day Out and a homeschool cooperative, each for a few hours several days each week.

RABC Pastor Jim Wolfe testified before the House Committee on Civil Law, May 6, that the congregation was in "the 19th month of struggling with a situation where some officials have come in, interpreting the law as saying that the business of the church is Sunday morning and Wednesday night." He further shared that any other activity with children and youth, even Vacation Bible School, which met outside those defined days of ministry, were considered outside the church's occupancy permit. His testimony was received favorably, and the committee moved the bill 12-0 to the House chamber where lawmakers adopted it 97-0. The measure was well received by the Senate, too, with the Education Committee unanimously moving it forward to the full Senate which adopted the bill 33-5.

OTHER KEY BILLS

In odd-numbered years, by law, the Louisiana legislature holds Fiscal Sessions during which bills whose "object is to enact the General Appropriation Bill" are considered as well as other financial matters relating to the state budget. However, each lawmaker may also prefile up to five bills on other subject matters.

Among the non-budgetary items, Louisiana Baptist legislators championed some significant measures.

-- Sen. Rick Edmonds, a retired pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, Shreveport, and current pastor, First Baptist Church, McComb, Mississippi, carried the banner for SCR41, which declares July "as a month of prayer and fasting, depriving ourselves in order to awaken our hunger for and need of God, humbling ourselves before Him, asking His forgiveness, and seeking His blessings, grace, and mercy so that we, our communities, our State, and our nation will be transformed."

-- Rep. Kim Carver, a deacon with First Baptist Church, Covington, battled Apple and other technology giants to move HB570 to become law as Act 481, which empowers parents to screen harmful material from children. Until this legislation was adopted, app stores allowed minors to download apps, agree to contractual "terms of ser-

vice," and then make purchases without a parent's consent -- leaving children susceptible to exploitative contracts and adult content. Effective July 1, 2026, app stores will be required to verify the age of customers, provide accurate age ratings for apps and contact parents for consent to allow minors to make app purchases. HB570 was adopted 98-0 by the House and 38-0 by the Senate and signed by Gov. Landry.

-- Rep. Mike Johnson (Speaker of the House Pro Tempore), a member with First Baptist Church, Pineville, led the fight to protect victims of domestic abuse from being stalked electronically in their cars. HB74, which was adopted unanimously in the House and the Senate and signed by the governor, requires motor vehicle manufacturers to provide the means for an abuse survivor to turn off remote access technology which could be used by the perpetrator of domestic abuse to track the vehicle.

-- Sen. Adam Bass, a member with Cypress Baptist Church, Benton, successfully advanced SB181 through the legislative process in his efforts to restrict the expansion of gambling in the state via the internet. This measure would have prevented "gambling by computer" by making it illegal for companies to conduct "sweepstakes" that are in fact gambling (a person risks something of value to realize a profit). The measure passed the House 99-0 and the Senate 39-0, and religious leaders across the state urged the governor to sign SB181, citing concerns about increases "in divorces, bankruptcies, depression, and brokenness" from any expansion in gambling. However, Gov. Landry vetoed the measure, writing that SB181 "is not necessary" because the "Louisiana Gaming Control Board ... is already taking active steps to combat illegal gambling in Louisiana."

MORAL & SOCIAL VICTORIES

Louisiana Baptists contributed to multiple other legislative victories via their representation through the Louisiana Baptist Office of Public Policy.

The LBC OPP gave testimony in:

-- support of SB58, which creates the crime of "child grooming" in Louisiana ("the pursuit of an intimate relationship with a child under the age of seventeen ... with the specific intent to commit a sex offense"). The bill was presented by Sen. Patrick Connick with input and counsel from the Louisiana District Attorneys Association. The LBC OPP is continuing to work with the LDAA to strengthen protections for students older than 17 years who might be vulnerable to being groomed by a teacher or professor or other authority figure in a Louisiana educa-

tional institution.

-- opposition to HB636, which proposed to create a system for taxing recreational marijuana. Rep. Edmond Jordan authored the bill, claiming that pot legalization would create a financial windfall for the state and that a tax system should be in place beforehand. The LBC OPP was the lone witness to testify against the measure, offering factual evidence that showed: (1) California's drastic drop in tax revenues from legal pot because of surging black markets of cheaper illegal pot; (2) Oregon's human trafficking surge on pot farms ("narco slavery"); (3) Louisiana's emergency room visits due to pot exceeding those due to opioids, heroin and other stimulants combined (even though recreational pot is illegal in the state); and, (4) Louisiana's youth (ages 12-17) abusing pot (ninth in the nation among other states).

HB636 lost 8-7 in the House Ways and Means Committee, and the bill was withdrawn.

-- opposition to HB22 that proposed residents in Concordia Parish vote on "whether to allow the operation of video draw poker devices." The LBC OPP testified that a legislatively sponsored study about the impact of legalized gambling in the state showed that, on average, about 40 percent of Louisiana students, 6th - 12th grades, already are gambling, and that expanding gambling opportunities for adults would negatively affect young people, too. Rep. Travis Johnson, who authored HB22, withdrew the bill when it became apparent that it was not going to pass.

-- offering two key amendments that were included in SB121/Act 469, authored by Sen. Larry Selders. This measure "requires each public school to offer mental health screenings for all students in grades K-12 during the first semester of the school year," starting in 2026-2027.

In order to mitigate potential overreach by this legislation, whose stated intent is to aid parents in getting help for their child, the LBC OPP successfully argued for (1) a ban against "metadata" (combining the informa-

tion from all the individual screenings), and (2) that parents have access to the actual questions that would be asked (so parents can make a fully informed decision about whether to allow their child to be screened).

also internalize their gifts and calling – experiencing firsthand what it means to share the Gospel, rather than just hearing about it,” Louisiana BCM State Director Mark Robinson told the *Baptist Message*. “It is a joy to watch them grow in confidence and boldness as they share their faith. At Louisiana BCM, our four pillars are Reach, Connect, Strengthen and Mobilize. We remain committed to mobilizing students with the Gospel to reach a world far from God.”

GOLA VBS

Ten students sowed Gospel seeds through GOLA (Go Louisiana) VBS in Louisiana and Wyoming. GOLA VBS is an LBC BCM emphasis that allows students to serve on teams who share God’s

love through what is the largest evangelistic outreach (VBS) of the year for many congregations. The teams typically conduct VBS for churches with low baptisms and who could not hold such an outreach without the help of GOLA volunteers. “I asked them to be flexible as teammates and evangelistic in what they do,” GOLA Coordinator and Louisiana Christian University BCM Director Brad Gill told the *Baptist Message*. “We have had churches say they appreciate what we did along the way. We were helping and serving churches who otherwise couldn’t put on a VBS.” Maisey Courtney, a sophomore with Louisiana State University of Alexandria, called her time as a summer missionary with GOLA “one

of the most beautiful seasons” of her life. One memory that touched her heart was when she led a youngster, Miley, to Christ during a VBS held by Sweetwater Church, Mandeville. Miley recently had moved into the community following the death of her father. By the end of the week, the youngster discovered that she has a Heavenly Father who loves her. “Even though many kids have made decisions this summer and each one is so precious to me, I’ll never forget how God used Smiley Miley to remind me of the joy and healing only He can bring,” Courtney said. “Watching her mom’s face light up as well when the pastor told her Miley gave a profession of faith reminded me that God isn’t just working in the kids, He’s reaching into homes and hearts I may never fully see. I could feel how hap-

py they both were.” Courtney was reminded of Psalm 34:18: “The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.” “He was near to Miley, near to her mom, and near to me too, even when I felt worn out and under attack,” Courtney said. “If there’s one thing I’ve learned, it’s that God uses willing hearts, not perfect ones. He moves even in our exhaustion. And He delights in child-like joy. Matthew 18:3 says, ‘Unless you become like little children, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven.’ “That truth came alive in Miley,” she continued. “So, I’d just encourage anyone: don’t give up when things feel heavy. Keep planting seeds. The joy of the Lord is still blooming, even in the hardest soil. And don’t ever feel too grown-up to worship like a child stay full of wonder, trust, and joy.

MISSIONAL CULTURE

Joe Luna, BCM director with Southeastern Louisiana University in Hammond, was excited that his students shared the Gospel in villages, Vacation Bible School, camps and construction and medical mission assignments. “We are seeing a culture of missional living developing in our ministry, first for our campus and now reaching out to the ends of the earth,” Luna said. “I’m so proud that they are not only willing, but desiring, to be self-sacrificial because it will help them understand and reflect the life of Jesus more fully. They recognize that it not only helps restore the world around them but also helps to further transform them into an image of Christ. That type of perception shift can’t be taught or forced but is all due to Christ’s transformation of their hearts.”

Meta, the parent company of Facebook/Instagram, is building an **Artificial Intelligence (A.I.)** data center in Richland Parish. This facility will bring temporary and full-time jobs to our state - along with the opportunity to share God's good news with them as they come!

I felt like the time was now, and I took on this opportunity."

O'Neal has served in various volunteer roles as

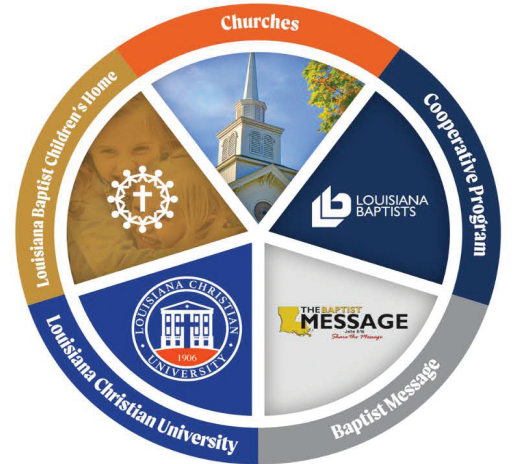

Price named Louisiana Baptist Foundation executive director

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – The Louisiana Baptist Foundation board of trustees announced, June 24, that Jared G. Price was elected the 10th executive director of the entity, a ministry of the Louisiana Baptist Conven-

tion. “I am grateful for the trust the board has placed in me and honored to continue serving Louisiana Baptists in this new role,” Price told the Baptist Message. “I remain fully committed to our current strategic plan, the LBF Vision200, which aims to advance the Kingdom with

\$200 million or more in 20 years or less. Five years in, I’m encouraged to share that we have already seen a cumulative impact of over \$76.9 million. As we look ahead, my prayer is that we continue to be good and faithful stewards of the resources entrusted to us and a trustworthy partner for Louisiana Baptists.”

The announcement followed a unanimous vote by the board of trustees upon the recommendation of a search committee comprised of board members and chaired by Wendell Whetstone, who is a member with Ellerbe Baptist Church, Shreveport, and a wealth advisor as well as chief financial officer with RoseStone Wealth Advisors in Shreveport.

Price, who assumes his new role on July 1, succeeds Jeffrey Steed, who retired as the Foundation’s executive director on May 31.

Whetstone said Price’s qualifications set him apart from other qualified applicants.

“In his previous roles as director of gift planning and interim executive director, Jared has been instrumental in helping the foundation in its goal of advancing the Kingdom,”

he said. “We are excited to have Jared leading the foundation forward. He had raving support, and his references were the best references I have ever heard in my lifetime.”

Louisiana Baptist Executive Director Steve Horn expressed excitement about the announcement.

“Jared has distinguished himself as a great leader,” he said. “He is enthusiastic about the work of the Foundation, particularly helping individuals have a comprehensive understanding of biblical stewardship.”

“I expect the Foundation to continue to excel in its mission to Louisiana Baptist churches and entities under Jared’s leadership,” Horn continued. “I look forward to many years of working with him.”

needs. When Will was born, the Robinsons, along with a dedicated group of volunteers, were led to organize a ministry geared to that demographic, with 10 people attending.

Through the years, the church added classes on Sundays for individuals with special needs and a separate class for their parents, a “Yes We Can!” annual festival and expo, summer camp and the Tim Tebow Night to Shine prom for individuals with special needs. In 2017, the church hired its first Special Friends Ministry coordinator, Pat Bourgeois.

“We are so happy Pastor Glynn and Melinda shared Will with us in the Special Friends Ministry,” she said. “We were able to learn more about him while connecting with him on an individual level. We could always hear Will coming down the hall to be with us. He could let us know in his own way what he wanted. He would inspire the volunteers when he said their name and bring a tear to the eyes when he would reach for a hand to hold. We repeated prayers and Bible stories to him, and his reward was watching a movie. We miss Will in Special Friends but look forward to seeing him running, jumping and welcoming us to Heaven.”

Melinda Robinson said she appreciated Will’s im-

pact on others.

“None of this was a surprise to God,” she said. “He knew how Will’s life was going to be, and he made us better people. Our girls are so strong and have such compassion for others from having Will as a sibling. Will took the life that that God gave him, and he lived it very well. We’re so proud of him for fulfilling the purpose that God had laid out for him.

“God doesn’t see limitations and He used Will in a very powerful way,” she continued. “He had his struggles, and we had days that were very difficult. But at the end of the day, we know this was God’s plan all along. There were days that we didn’t feel like we were equipped, but God always was faithful to equip us for whatever hit us that day.”

Glynn Robinson said he was thankful for a church that embraced their son and family.

“I don’t think people can sometimes see the value of special needs children in the world, but in God’s Kingdom we can clearly see their value,” he said. “And so, we’re just so honored to be part of a church who not only shares the love of Jesus with these kids but also actually ministers to their families. There’s not been a moment that we haven’t felt loved.”

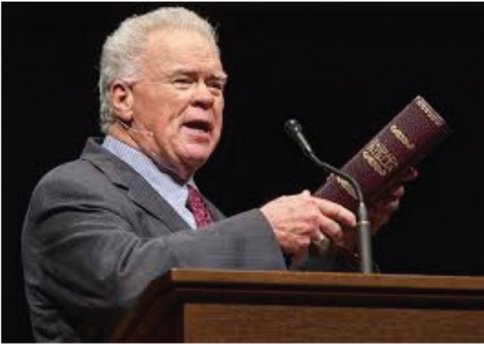

Leavell College launches ServeNOLA program

NEW ORLEANS (LBM) – New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary has begun a new program that allows incoming Leavell College students to explore their calling through a sustained season of service in the city during their first year of enrollment.

Approved by the board of trustees during its October meeting, the “ServeNOLA” program will accept its first students in the fall.

“Through ServeNOLA, we will have better students at Leavell College, and eventually at the seminary, who will be equipped to go into local churches across Louisiana and across the country because we have 18, 19, 20 year old students who have

learned how to do hands-on ministry in one of the most diverse cities in the country while they’re being mentored, shaped and poured into,” ServeNOLA Program Director Luke Johnson told the Baptist Message. “We will teach them how to seek the Lord and how they can share Jesus.”

According to the seminary website, the program is meant to support NOBTS’ mission of preparing servants to walk with Christ, proclaim His truth, and fulfill His mission, as well as the seminary’s four pillars (servanthood, devotion, proclamation, and mission).

The five key components of the program spell out its main emphasis (SERVE):

- Strengthen your walk with Christ through weekly meetings with a mentor.
- Engage New Orleans

by partnering with local outreach ministries.

-- Reach the nations in a

global context.

-- Volunteer at local churches in New Orleans.

-- Earn course credit when you meet with your mentor.

Those who participate will live on campus and earn up to 30 credit hours as they volunteer with local established churches, church plants and mercy ministries; serve refugees at a North American Mission Board center in Clarkston, Georgia; minister to those in the city through the seminary’s MissionLab; participate in a mission trip through the International Mission Board; and engage in a weekly mentor-based discipleship cohort.

“This new program through Leavell College is a perfect opportunity for students that are still exploring God’s direction in their lives,” NOBTS and Leavell College President Jamie Dew said. “These students are mentored

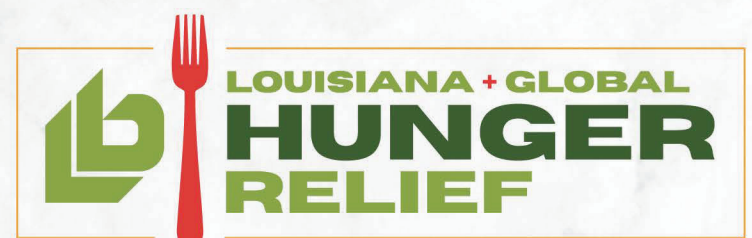

Life Changers pastor seek a transformed Zachary

ZACHARY, La. (LBM) – In 2022, Sheldon Early was finishing his classwork at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary when he caught onto a vision that God would allow him to help start a church that one day would see Zachary changed for Christ.

Three years later, the church has seen 40 baptisms and countless others grow deeper in their relationships with Christ, and Early is excited about the impact his congregation is making.

“We believe we can change one life at a time,” Pastor Sheldon Early told the Baptist Message. “We might not can save the whole world, but we can change one life at a time.”

Since he began with a group of 20 core members in November 2022, the congregation has grown

to 120 in Sunday worship, reaching near capacity occupancy in worship. So, the church may add a second service.

Early credits the men’s ministry as a driving force behind growth at Life Changers Church.

The men meet monthly to encourage and sharpen one another to be more fully devoted followers of Christ -- within the church and throughout the community. During a renovation of the worship center, the men worked two hours every Tuesday for five months until the job was completed in early 2024.

“It’s so encouraging when I sit with these brothers and I realize they have my back,” Early said. “They see what I’m trying to do and what we’re trying to do, and they come alongside me. All I have to do is say ‘I need this’ and they do it. It’s so encouraging to see these brothers

stand behind God’s Word and have a pride behind it.”

Reginald Brumfield is one of the men who invests in the church through efforts including a discipleship class for children. The life change he has seen out of that ministry focus reflects the church’s effort to see Zachary changed for Jesus.

“Our mission is about changing people’s lives for the better through Christ and being there for them in their time of need,” he said. “Every time I step inside our church or help with an outreach outside our walls, I get excited because I see people who are growing to be more like Jesus. I’m happy to be part of this community movement because I think we are changing people’s lives.”

Stefan Smith said the church has allowed him to fulfill a desire for creating a community within the congregation. In turn, he has grown deeper in Jesus

and allowed a welcoming environment for life change.

“I’ve always known Christ, but this church has opened me up more to serving Him and growing more,” he said. “It has helped me to read and understand the Word better and really helped me to realize that I need fellowship with others and I need God in my life.”

Early is quick to emphasize others in the church also are passionate about serving and growing spiritually:

-- Jewels for Christ, a group of teenage girls, participated in a sleepover at the church and assembled boxes of toiletries that they distributed to nursing homes and other organizations.

-- Every three months, the church offers free clothing and feeds more than 100 community mem-

bers on its property.

Early has seen fruit come from this multi-pronged effort.

“We put up a sign and only ask ‘How can we pray for them,’” he said. “We have seen people get saved, had a couple of people join our church, and our Zachary neighbors give us encouraging feedback that keeps us going.”

As the church looks to the future, Early is anticipating how God will continue to use his church to reach Zachary and beyond for Christ.

“It’s tremendous to be able to see how God is working and to see how God is moving through a church plant,” Early said. “I have heard a lot of church plants don’t make it. I’m just grateful I have been graced to lead a great group of people who have caught hold to this vision that we change one life at a time.”

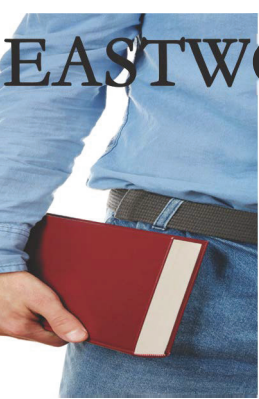

They ministered together for many of those years by working revivals together and being in charge of the music at the church we were serving in.
